

I remember how elated I was getting the acceptance letter from Edwards, my first choice for college. It took a lot of hard work to get here, I have always been consistent in my academics and have done my best to ensure that my education is prioritized above all else. I did not fully expect the financial difficulty of attending school, having been

restricted to 20 hours a week to work until recent, being responsible for living expenses and tuition is very hard. I had to rely on support from family, which is limited given Jamaica’s much weaker currency.

When I arrived in Canada, I worked two full time jobs to help with my tuition and have taken pride in keeping a similar work ethic since then. I learned my hard work doesn’t go unnoticed with The Edward’s Dean’s Circle Funding. I would not be here without the generosity of donors like you.

Today, I’m an Accounting co-op student that is grateful for the opportunity to enter the work force. I see every day as a blessing because there were many times my situation brought me close to going back home without completing my education goal. I am beyond proud and grateful to have been one of the recipients of the Edwards Dean's Circle Enhance and Innovate Award this year.

I grew up in a middle-class family in a small town in Vietnam, since I was thirteen, my younger sister and I have been raised and educated by a strong and hard-working single mother, who has continuously made sacrifices for us. She supported my education so that one day I would have a life she never had. I have always understood that my academic journey in Canada is all my mom's hopes and dreams and that I have a responsibility to succeed and take care of my sister.

This has not been an easy journey, and one of my biggest sources of anxiety and stress is financial

insecurity. As an international student, not only am I restricted to work 20 hours a week, but the increased study time due to language barriers also reduces my capacity to work. As a result, during my first few years in Canada, I relied heavily on my mom to pay for the high and fast-increasing tuition fees, while she was working in part-time, minimum-wage jobs to provide for us. I remember times when I skipped meals after converting Canadian dollars into Vietnamese Dong to see what a supper would cost me.

The Dean's Circle has been one of the most generous and stable donors to students. These scholarships mean a lot more than "just money." They are a source of motivation and encouragement, a reassurance that I am walking the right path, doing the right things, and spending the right efforts. For many students in need, the funding assures food on the table, more time off work to study, or a little relief for their family who are making sacrifices to support their education. Under the current economy, with rising inflation and costs of living, there is no doubt that the impact of your support will become even more meaningful to current and future hard-working students, dreamers, and future nation-builders.

I am about to conclude a successful 12-month co-op work term and enter my final year in university. I feel inspired, hopeful, and confident and I am excited to finish my academic journey next year with valuable knowledge and experience. Please know that your generous financial support has helped me immensely through all these years.
