I would like to acknowledge the recent planned gift and Walter Murray Scholarship from current Dean's Circle member, Jack Neumann. This generous contribution reflects a lasting commitment to giving back, ensuring that our initiatives continue to thrive and support students for generations to come. Additionally, we are grateful for the gift from past Dean's Circle member, Wayne Brownlee, which led to establishment and support for the upcoming Prairie Business Summit in May 2025. These gifts are a testament to the ongoing commitment of our community, and we are incredibly thankful for their lasting impact.

This spirit of generosity plays a crucial role in funding initiatives that enhance the student experience and empower the next generation of leaders. Your contributions were particularly impactful in providing co-curricular funding for undergraduate students. This support enabled the Edwards Business Student Society to attend key conferences, including the Ted Rogers Management Conference in Toronto, the National Business School Conference in Winnipeg, and the Canadian Association of Business Schools Roundtable in Vancouver. Additionally, 14 Enactus students participated in the Enactus Canada Regionals Expositions in Calgary this March.

Your contributions as Dean's Circle members continue to play a vital role in advancing Indigenous engagement at Edwards. By supporting awards for students from rural, urban, and local Indigenous communities, we are able to bridge gaps and provide opportunities for undergraduate and graduate students who might otherwise face barriers to higher education.

We recognize the essential role of peer mentor learning communities in fostering collaboration and leadership skills. Through your support, Edwards introduced its first Learning Communities in the 2023-24 academic year, with five peer mentors guiding 38 new students. Your impact has been profound, as these programs have proven invaluable in creating supportive networks where upper-year students help mentor their peers.

New initiatives include a focus on student food security, student emergency funding and MBA awards. Recognizing that students may face unexpected financial hardships, the food and emergency initiatives ensures those in crisis can receive support to cover their immediate needs. Students work closely with advisors to identify and address the challenges they encounter. The student emergency funding provides assistance to students who encounter emergency situations. With the support of this fund, students can access help quickly while navigating through difficult circumstances. The new funding stream for MBA awards provides financial assistance to graduate students, ensuring that talented individuals can continue their education without the burden of financial stress.

As we reflect on the past year, I am filled with gratitude for your continued support, which directly impacts the lives of many students. Your contributions to scholarships and bursaries have made it possible for students to focus on their studies by reducing the added stress of financial concerns. Together, we are creating opportunities, overcoming barriers, and shaping the future of our academic community.


